

## Please stay at home:

The Government's message was clear that everyone who can work from home must work from home, however we will still provide care for families of essential workers and vulnerable children. <p><b>1. Student name &amp; Home group:</b> I.e. John Smith 4E</p>	<p><b>2. Circumstances:</b> Circumstances that require the student to be supervised at school, eg both parents are permitted workers and no older sibling or relation at home or nearby to supervise.</p>	<p><b>3. Essential Worker Information:</b> Job title, work hours, start and finish times and a contact number to confirm details at the permitted workplace will be required).</p>

## Continuity of Learning – Circuit Breaker Plan:

Ongoing routine is very important for children of all ages so this information is designed to give your child continuity with their learning and to help you continue and establish a daily routine. Please continue to develop their independence by expecting them to set up and clean up their own activities, dress themselves and care for their belongings

This Circuit Breaker Plan includes **general reading, writing and maths activities** suitable for your child to work on for their year level. We have also included some generic activities that you can do at home via **worksheets** sent home on Friday. (There is no need to come to school to collect these). And, we have a recommended list of other **websites** that are available to support student learning if needed.

Students have brought home a **workbook** and a pen/cil. In general, this is the PRIMARY TIMETABLE to follow for the 3 days, although you can complete tasks at any time and in any order. The **Zoom** times and links will be sent to your Compass.

<p><b>Read to Someone</b></p> <p>When reading fictional texts, record predictions, connections, reactions and a summary of daily reading</p>	<p><b>Read Independently</b></p> <p>Choose a Just Right book (one that will challenge you, but which you can enjoy) and enjoy your read.</p>	<p><b>Epic!</b></p> <p>If you have access to Epic, find a book and enjoy your read!</p>
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## WRITING

<p><b>Write a Narrative</b></p> <p>Plan, draft, revise and edit a personal narrative piece based on an event in your life. Take this piece through the writing process; plan, draft, revise, edit, publish. You need to spend 30 minutes each day writing.</p>	<p><b>Write a Persuasive</b></p> <p>Plan, draft, revise and edit a persuasive piece about 'What's one thing you would change about Manor Lakes Primary?' Take this piece through the writing process.</p>	<p><b>Write a Poem</b></p> <p>Choose a topic and use your senses to reflect! Write a 5 Senses Poem. E.g Step outside your front door and record what you can see, hear, taste, smell and touch. Draw and accompanying illustration.</p>
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## MATHS

<p><b>Fluency Fun!</b></p> <p>Practise your counting patterns. Select the one's you're ready for:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 2, 5, 10</li> <li>2. 3, 4</li> <li>3. 6, 8, 9, 7</li> </ol>	<p><b>Problem Solving</b></p> <p>How many people could fit in your lounge room (or a room of choice)? Use <b>formal</b> (cms, m<sup>2</sup>, rulers, tape measures etc) or <b>informal</b> measurement (a chair, newspaper cutout etc) to figure this out.</p>	<p><b>Practising Place Value</b></p> <p>Roll a dice and make any three digit number.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Say the numbers out loud.</li> <li>2. Write them down using digits.</li> <li>3. Write them down using words.</li> <li>4. Order the numbers from highest to lowest</li> <li>5. Place them all on a number line</li> </ol> <p>Repeat this process at least 4 times.</p>
