Online Public Speaking

Registration for online public speaking is open!

Students will be required to submit an unedited video of a prepared speech which must be persuasive in nature. This will then be marked by two DAV adjudicators and successful students will progress to the final, which will require a second video speech to be submitted. The cost for the program will be \$15 per student. There is no limit to the number of students per school who can participate, however a maximum of 3 students per school will be able to progress to the final. **Registration closes 30th April 5pm.**

Accessing Digital Resources as purchased through Campion

Manor Lakes P-12 College uses Campion for our book listing and resourcing for secondary students. Booklists for each year level are available on the College website: <https://manorlakesp12.vic.edu.au/students/>

All digital texts purchased by families through Campion are now available online to access, at home or at school, on any internet connected device. This includes the Jacaranda Digital Bundle being used by all students from Years 7 to 10, as well as the digital textbooks used for VCE subjects at Year 11 and 12.

FAQs

1. How do I access the digital textbooks I have purchased?

Students should use a web browser to go to Campion MyConnect at:

<https://myconnectshop.campion.com.au/login.htm>

Students should enter the following username and password credentials

Username: xxxxxxx@manorlakesp12.vic.edu.au

(substitute your Manor Lakes student code for xxxxxxx. This is the same user code you use for Compass, and is the first three initials of your surname, followed by a 4-digit number, e.g. wat0001).

Password: ManorLakes3024

(this password is case sensitive).

2. How often will my child be using the digital textbooks?

The Jacaranda Digital Bundle is considered an essential resource for all students in Years 7 to 10, and we ask families to do everything they can to purchase this bundle for their children in these year levels. The bundle includes around 14 textbooks, used across nearly all subjects. Most VCE subjects also have a digital textbook or hardcopy textbook, and these are also considered essential.

3. Can I just get hardcopy versions of the digital textbooks?

We have endeavoured to make the resource list as accessible and cost-effective as possible. This is why we have chosen to booklist one digital bundle from Jacaranda for all Year 7 to 10 students. At \$119.95, students receive

about 14 textbooks, accessed by one set of login details. Students then don't have to carry around several heavy printed hardcopy textbooks. Digital textbooks are much cheaper than printed textbooks. Some VCE subjects have the option of printed or digital textbooks.

4. How do I access financial support for learning resources for my child?

Any families requiring financial support with any items in the booklists, or for laptops, are to contact the school by calling on 9741 4202, or students can approach their Year Level Coordinator, Head of School, or any of the Secondary Principals, to let them know what resources they need financial support for. This includes laptops, textbooks, the digital bundle, or stationary.

5. Where can I get help if I am having trouble accessing the digital textbooks?

More detailed instructions, including tutorial videos, are provided in the pdf attachment, as supplied by Campion.

Please also check your emails for any other codes that may get sent to you from Campion, and be sure to check your junk folder.

Same-day notification of unexplained student absences:

Save this number! Our school uses SMS to contact parents as soon as practical on the day of an unexplained absence. Save this number 9741 4202 into your phone so you know it is the school contacting you

Our school will text you as soon as practical on the day a student is not at school and you haven't notified the school as to why. If you are notified by the school that your child is away without reason, please contact us as soon as possible by calling 9741 4202 or entering the absence electronically via Compass.

Please remember it is your responsibility to contact us to provide an explanation for your child's absence from school. Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

All Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

If you are concerned that your child is home for reasons not related to illness or family commitments, and you would like someone at the college to assist you, please do not hesitate to ring the college.
