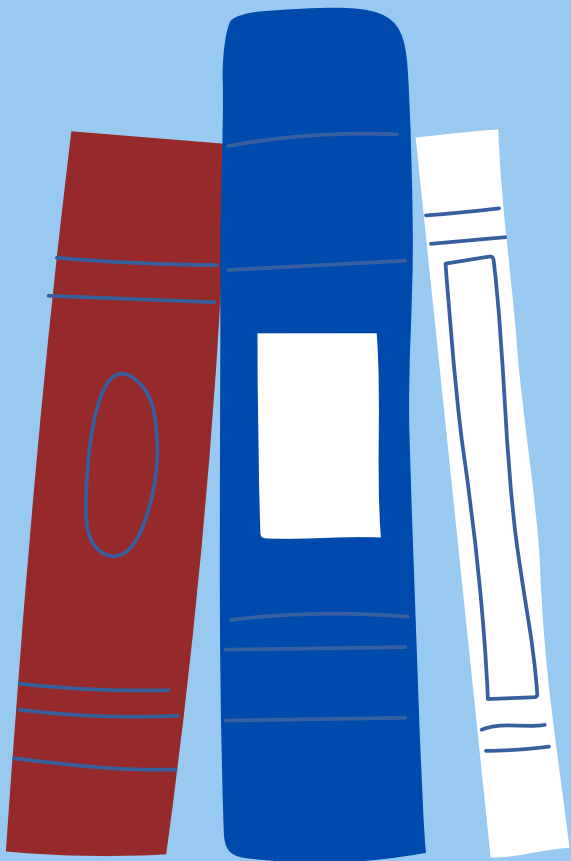

THE INHERITANCE GAMES

Background Information

The Inheritance Games by Jennifer Lynn Barnes is a thrilling read full of romance, drama and secrets. The book, part of a series also titled *The Inheritance Games*, was published in 2020 and is recommended readers aged 13+.

Plot Summary

She came from nothing.

Avery has a plan: keep her head down, work hard for a better future. Then an eccentric billionaire dies, leaving her almost his entire fortune. And no one, least of all Avery, knows why.

They had everything.

Now she must move into the mansion she's inherited. It's filled with secrets and codes, and the old man's surviving relatives – a family hellbent on discovering why Avery got 'their' money.

Now there's only one rule: winner takes all.

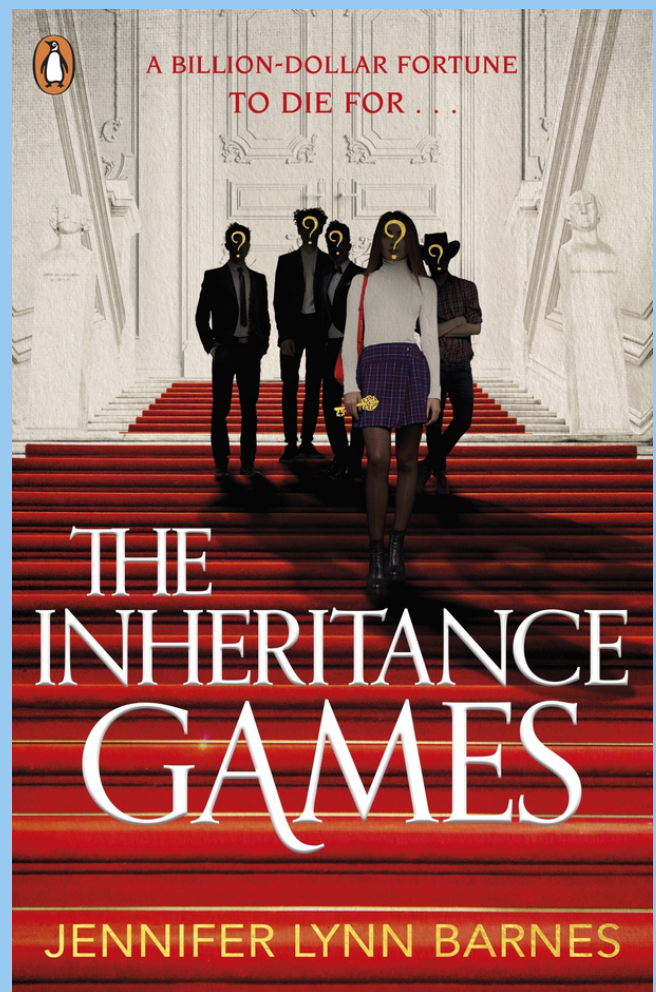
Avery is soon caught in a deadly game that everyone in this strange family is playing. But just how far will they go to keep their fortune?

My Review

I got the book last year and I've already read it multiple times. Often people say that a mystery story is only a one-time read, but I found *The Inheritance Games* wasn't like that, so long as you like the plot and characters.

My favourite character from the book was Avery, because her personality was one I would want, and being in Avery's position is something many people would want. I mean, I wouldn't mind inheriting billions.

Another character I really liked was Tobias Hawthorne. Although he was dead from the start of the book, the text would not be as it is without him. I really wish the author had introduced him a living character at some point, but I still enjoyed the background presence of Tobias Hawthorne.

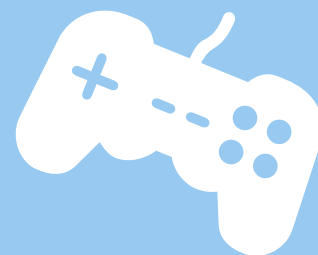

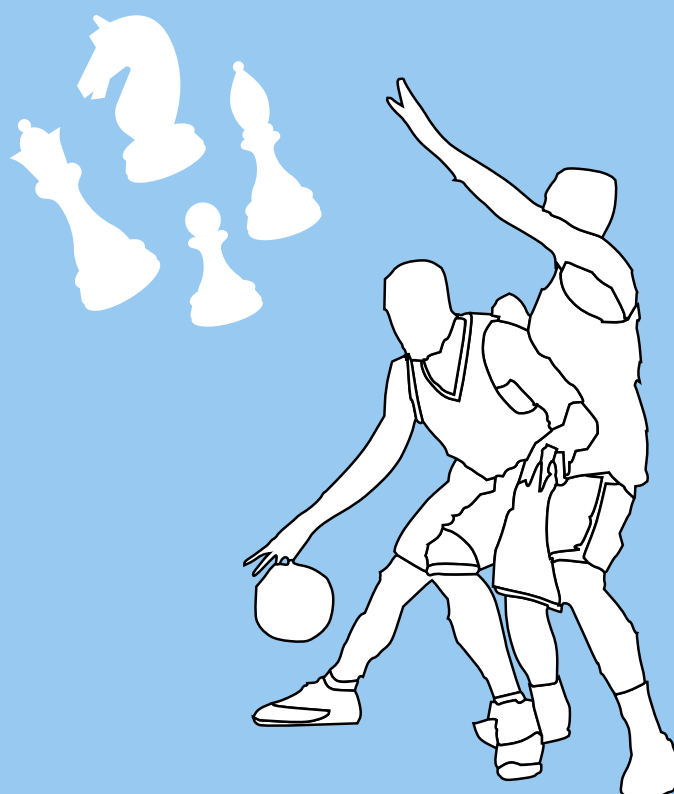
