COSI By Louis Nowra

Background Information

A play by Australian playwright Louis Nowra, *Cosi* was first performed at the Belvoir St Theatre in Sydney in 1992. Nowra has also written other plays such as *The Golden Age*, which was written and performed in 1985. This book is recommended for readers ages 15+.

Plot Summary


Lewis is a new university graduate who has agreed to direct a play cast with patients from a mental institution because he needs money. At first, Lewis shares the same values as his friends Nick and Lucy, that love is 'not so important' in the days of politics and war. However, during the time he spends with the patients, Lewis experiences a turning point in his understanding and perception of people.

My Review

Cosi was a play that was a part of school reading for Year 11, and when I read it the first time it wasn't a text that I really enjoyed.

However, when we started to analyse *Cosi* in class, I found greater depth in the text and the themes it represented.

Despite using only dialogue, the author gave a basic understanding of the emotions of characters, but what really struck me was that the setting was described really well. There was only one setting in the text and through character dialogue and occasional description, we as readers are able to have a much better understanding of the setting. And if looked into deeply, we can see what it represents.
