

# **ADDISON EARNS STATE MVP HONOURS**


Our resident baseball star, Year 11 student Addison Bishop-Worn, performed strongly at the recent School Boys Baseball Championship in Lismore, New South Wales.

# Pho Ga (Chicken Noodle Soup)

# **Ingredients**

# **Broth:**

500ml Roasted vegetable stock

15ml Fish sauce1 slice Galangal1 slice Ginger

2 Spring onion tops (sliced)

1 Cinnamon stick

Star aniseTbsp Caster sugar

### Garnish:

Chicken breastRice noodles

1 Spring onion (sliced)

50 gm Bean sprouts

1 Egg

½ Birds eye chilli (sliced)

1 Lime (quartered)

2 Tbsp Fried shallots

1 tsp Roasted peanuts (crushed)1 Tbsp Coriander leaves (picked)1 Tbsp Vietnamese mint (shredded)

1 tsp Chopped garlic chives

Large pinch of freshly ground black pepper

### Method

- Dry roast the cinnamon, star anise, ginger and shallots.
- To make the broth, simmer all of the ingredients over a gentle heat for 10 to 15 minutes.
- Add the chicken breast and simmer in the broth for 8 to 10 minutes to cook the chicken.
- Remove the chicken from the broth and shred it.
- Season the broth with fish sauce and lime juice and strain it through a fine meshed chinoise.
- Make a thin omelette with the egg, cool and then slice into strips.
- Reconstruct the rice noodles by placing them into boiling water and stand for 10 minutes.
- In order to serve, reheat the broth if needed.
- Warm a deep soup bowl and add the chicken, noodles, egg strips and bean sprouts.
- Pour over the broth and add the remaining garnishes.

# **MY PERSONAL TIP:**

This recipe looks more complicated than it is. Once the broth is ready, all you have to do is present the other ingredients with it. However, I would recommend checking if the chicken is cooked by cutting it in the middle, and remember rice noodles cook fast so keep an eye out for them. Lastly, all the herbs are for garnish so if they are not available to you, you can opt them out for something you do have that complements the broth.


We shouldn't forget who started it all. Back in 2006, a young Tracy J. Butler never knew she had made her biggest hit yet when she created *Lackadaisy*.
