

# FIELD OF DREAMS

The big wait is over. Our students can finally enjoy our very own field of dreams. After much anticipation and excitement, the school oval opened to our primary students on Monday, and they have flocked to it every recess and lunchtime since.

Students have engaged in various activities on the oval, including active pursuits such as cricket, football, soccer, races, tag and walking laps, along with more relaxed fun involving reclining on the grass and hanging out with friends.

Teachers have also enjoyed the grass and sunshine, and might soon have more reason to smile given the benefits of exercise on learning. Healthy body, healthy mind.

As part of a joint venture with Wyndham City Council, we will use the oval during school hours and local football and cricket clubs will have access to it after hours and at weekends for training and competition.

It's a terrific surface with much thicker, spongier grass than the adjacent community oval. It's a little smaller, being about 400 metres around, compared to the 500m of the community oval, but it's certainly big enough for the school's needs.

#### Voice to Parliament

You may have heard of the 'Voice to Parliament' proposal – and if you haven't, you certainly will in the coming months. The Voice to Parliament, if successful, will be a group of indigenous leaders representing First Nations people across Australia, to give advice to the government and to the parliament about solutions to problems that affect indigenous communities.

The Albanese Government wants to enshrine the Voice in the Constitution, which means it will be impossible to get rid of, without all Australians voting. It also means that it will be hard to establish because the Voice to Parliament needs to be voted on by every single Australian through a referendum, which is expected to happen after October. Every Australian will need to vote either 'Yes' or 'No' for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament.

Albanese's Labor and the Greens have thrown their support behind the Voice, while the National Party has said it's against the proposal, and the Liberal Party doesn't officially have a position yet but is expected to allow its members to vote however they like.

Supporters of the Voice say indigenous Australians deserve a say in matters that affect them. Those who are against the Voice are concerned that there isn't enough detail about the proposed changes.

If you are in Year 12 and/or are turning 18 this year, chances are that you will have to vote in this referendum. Regardless of your opinion, it is compulsory to vote in all elections and referendums as an Australian citizen. It takes only two minutes to enrol to vote and you can enrol if you're aged at least 16, so get it over and done with by enrolling to vote at https://www.aec.gov.au/enrol/.

#### SOCIOLOGY ADVENTURE

The Year 12 Sociology class had a cultural-knowledge-packed day in the city on Tuesday.

Furthering their learning about indigenous Australian culture and its history, they visited Melbourne Museum's exhibition 'Bunjilaka', which showcased indigenous Australian culture through art and interactive activities.

They also attended the 'Identity: yours, mine, ours' exhibition at the Immigration Museum.

Both experiences were very beneficial, providing students with a deeper understanding of "culture" and "identity".

The exhibitions featured many personal stories of First Nations peoples, including stories of the Stolen Generation, of survival, and the Dreaming (dreamtime stories). Many new things were learned about the lives of indigenous people before colonisation and the challenges they faced afterwards.

The class has been learning about the two types of culture – material culture (tangible items) and non-material culture (ideas, beliefs and values). A piece of material culture they have been studying are possum-skin cloaks (pictured right, bottom two images), which are made and given to indigenous Australians as babies, and as they grow up, more material is added to the cloak so they "grow" with it. Designs and patterns are burned into the cloak to personalise it. It was intriguing to see possum-skin cloaks in real life.

#### **Poached Pears**

#### **Ingredients**

2 litres Water

1 kg Sugar

1 Stick cinnamon

1 Orange, zested

1 Lemon, zested

1 Vanilla bean, split lengthways

50 ml Brandy

1 Pear



My attempt.

#### Method

- Put all ingredients, other than the pear, into the pot and bring to the boil.
- Reduce the heat to a poaching temperature (90-95 degrees).
- Peel the skin of the pear and add it to the pot to be poached and cover with a cartouche (a circular shape cut out of baking paper).
- Other ingredients can be added to the stock syrup to achieve the desired flavours.
- Check the pear every few minutes with a toothpick to see how soft the pear is and how easily the toothpick goes into the pear. Once the pear is soft and to a poaching consistency, remove from pot and serve with desired toppings.


#### **MY PERSONAL TIPS:**

When making poached pears, be sure to monitor the temperature and do not let it get to a boil. Keep the pot covered to keep the steam in and only remove the lid to check the pear, which I would recommend doing every now and then in order to avoid overcooking the pear. The dish can be served with chocolate sauce and your preferred nuts, I tend to use pistachios for this dish.
